





Read John 11:18-44

¹⁸Now Bethany was near Jerusalem, about two miles off; ¹⁹and many of the Jews had come to Martha and Mary, to console them concerning their brother Lazarus. ²⁰Martha therefore, when she heard that Jesus was coming, left to meet Him. But Mary stayed at the house.

²¹Martha said to Jesus, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died. ²²But even now I know that whatever You ask of God, He will give You."

²³Jesus answered and said, "Your brother will rise again."

²⁴Martha said, "I know he will rise again, in the resurrection on the last day."

²⁵Jesus said to her, "I am the resurrection and the life; he who believes in Me, though he die, yet shall he live, ²⁶and everyone who lives and believes in Me will never die. Do you believe this?"

²⁷She said to Him, "Yes, Lord; I believe that You are the Christ, the Son of God, even He who was to come into the world."

²⁸When she had said this, she went away and returned to Mary her sister, and said to her privately, "The Teacher has come near, and he is calling for you."

²⁹And when she heard this, she got up immediately, and left to go and meet Him. ³⁰Jesus had not yet come into the village, but was still in the place where Martha had met Him. ³¹Then those Jews who were with Mary and were consoling her, when they saw her get up and go out, followed her, supposing she was going to the tomb to weep.

³²Therefore, when Mary came to where Jesus was, she saw Him, and fell down at His feet, and said, "Lord, if You had been here, my brother would not have died."

³³When Jesus saw her weeping, and those Jews who came with her also weeping, He was deeply moved in spirit and troubled. ³⁴Then Jesus said, "Where have you laid him?" And they said, "Lord, come and see."

³⁵Jesus wept.

³⁶So the Jews were saying, "See how He loved him!" ³⁷But some said, "Could not this man, who opened the eyes of the blind, have kept this man also from dying?"

³⁸Jesus, again deeply moved within, came to the tomb. It was a cave, with a stone lying against it. ³⁹So Jesus said, "Remove the stone." But Martha, the sister of the deceased, said to Him, "Lord, by this time there will be a stench, for he has been dead four days."

⁴⁰Jesus said to her, "Did I not say to you that if you believe, you will see the glory of God?"

⁴¹So they removed the stone. Then Jesus raised His eyes, and said, "Father, I thank You that You have heard Me. ⁴²I know that You always hear Me; but because of the people standing around I said it, so that they may believe that You have sent Me." ⁴³And when He had said these things, He cried out with a loud voice, "Lazarus, come forth!" ⁴⁴And the man who had died came forth, bound hand and foot with wrappings, and with his face wrapped in a cloth. Then Jesus said to them, "Unbind him, and let him go."

Discussion Questions

1. Describe the main characters in this story, and their relationship to Jesus.
2. Why would Lazarus' death be a hardship for this family? What expectations did they have of Jesus when they sent for Him, and what impact did His delay — and Lazarus's subsequent death — have? Who else had expectations of Jesus?
3. How did Martha and Mary deal with their deep disappointment in Jesus? Why did Jesus weep?
4. What does this story symbolize for us, spiritually?
5. What are some other take aways that you have received from this narrative about the raising of Lazarus?
6. Describe how Jesus came into your life and called you forth, and freed you from your grave clothes.
