Study Questions

- 1) Job is the oldest book of the Bible and is thought, according to Jewish tradition, to have been written by whom? Who does it introduce us to?
- 2) Read Job 38:1-7. As God instructs Job and his “friends” He teaches us about creation. What do we learn? How does Lucifer fit into the picture?
- 3) What is the opposite of rebellion? What is the first step toward rebellion? Why does God stop Job from questioning God?
- 4) Read Ezekiel 28:12-15. What does Satan have to do with this passage? How did his rebellion effect the heart of God?
- 5) Genesis 6:5-6 gives another example of rebellion that must have effected God's heart. What was it?
- 6) Later, when Saul rebelled and was removed as King, God’s choice for King over His people was David. Why? How important is worship to God's heart? Can we be next to God's heart the way that the youngest apostle, John, leaned in to be next to the heart of Jesus during the Last Supper? (See John 13:23) How can we lean in so that we are next to the heart of Jesus today? What are the benefits we receive back when we do so?

End this study by reading out loud: Psalm 103, Psalm 91, Psalm 23, and John 3:16. Let your heart soar and your lips worship God as you recline into the very heart of God. Then journal your experience.
